PROGRAM NOTES

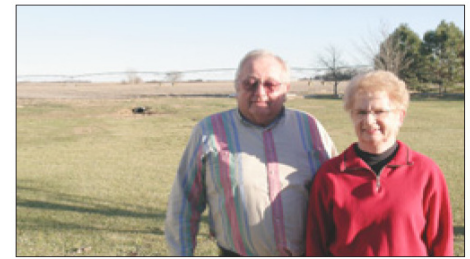
Nov 2nd—Donna Dill, from the League of Women Voters, came to encourage all to exercise their right to vote. The League is a political organization that is non-partisan. It was started by women in the 1920's but now is open to men as well. They strive to reduce voter apathy through education. In Nebraska only 54% of those eligible are registered and last May only 45% of those registered voted. The League actively promotes registration of voters, sponsors forums to inform voters and educate folks about voting laws and changes in the laws that affect us. Some of the items of note this year are the State-wide voter registration lists available on line for folks to know if and how they are registered, absentee ballots that are available if you wish to vote early for any reason, provisional ballots you can ask for right at the polls if you have moved, and a new machine called “Auto Mark” that will be in every polling place for disabled voters.

Nov 16th—Our own Jim Heyen, Hastings School Board member, was excited to introduce to us Principal, Jeff Schneider, and Director of Technology, Trent Kelly, who came to tell us about the progress on the new Hastings Middle School. They knew the voters were glad about the results last spring when someone called at 7:30 in the morning the day after the vote to chat about what was going to happen next!. Since then there has been “tons of communication”, meetings, visitations with many who have recently built new schools and input from the teachers, the community, the architects, and anybody who could provide input. Security, traffic flow, rooms that work for the teachers and many other items were discussed and changes made. The dirt work has started and will go on until spring. August 29, 2006 they held a ground breaking. They expect completion on December 31, 2007. On January 8, 2008, the seventh and eighth grades will move in. Then on August 8, 2008 the sixth grade will join them.

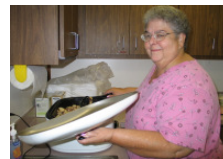

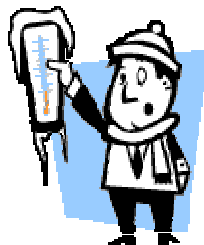
